**The Departmental Confirmation Committee had screened the service records of the five faculty members and affirmed for their Integrity/Vigilance Clearance, Character and Antecedents verification.**

**Service confirmation of the five faculty members is approved.**



**BOG 21.9****Service Confirmation of Teaching Faculty recruited under the 5 Years Contractual Service.****Background:**

Consonant to the Model Recruitment Rules of Faculty in NITs, 2011 vide Para. 24, copy at **Annexure I of BoG 21.9 at Page No. 154-158**, the under-mentioned Faculties were recruited through Direct Recruitment Mode with M.Tech Degree, as Assistant Professors on contract basis with AGP of Rs. 6000/- only, with a rider that they would be regularised upon completion of their Ph.Ds, i.e. w.e.f. the date of their entry into the Institute and that their previous services would be counted for administrative and other service benefits.

However, vide Para. 24(V) of the Model Recruitment Rules of Faculty in NITs, 2011, the incumbent Faculties were to be placed "**on probation of 1 (one) year after regularisation**". This requirement of one year probation had occurred as an oversight and had not been conveyed to the incumbent Faculties nor reflected in the Offer of Appointments **Annexure II of BoG 21.9 at Page No. 159-162** and Order of Regularisation, copies at **Annexure III of BoG 21.9 at Page No. 163-166**.

The inadvertent error may be condoned and the one year period of probation be deemed to have occurred after the regularisation of their services. Thereafter, service confirmation may be taken up by the Departmental Confirmation Committee (DCC), on an *ex-post facto* basis.

adjustments, the post of SAS be surrendered and the post of Deputy Registrar be sanctioned in lieu thereof so that the vacant sanctioned post of Assistant Registrar is retained due to administrative necessity. Earlier, the vacant sanctioned post of Nurse being an essential requirement in the Institute had been proposed not to be adjusted against the post of Matron and due to the fact that the incumbent Matron does not possess the eligibility criteria of a Nurse vide Letter No. NITMZ/BOG/8/2017/46 dated 13.02.2018, No. NITMZ/BOG/12/2018/75 dated 01.02.2019 & No. NITMZ/C-75/2012/1194 dated 10.01.2019, copies are placed at **Annexures -III of BOG 21.10 at page no 177-179** Response from the Ministry is awaited.

Given that the services of the aforesaid officer/staff is yet pending confirmation even after 9+ years of service, it is therefore proposed that their services be confirmed by invoking the Govt of India, DoPT, O.M No.18011/1/86-Estt.(D) dated 28.03.1988 on '*Simplification of confirmation procedure-Delinking of confirmation from the availability of permanent posts*' and the subsequent Govt of India, DoPT, O.M No. 28020/3/2018-Estt.(C) dated 11.03.2019 on *Master Circular on Probation/Confirmation in Central Services-reg*, Para 2 & Para 24 copies are placed at **Annexure - IV & V of BOG 21.10 at page no 180-189**, wherein, it clearly depicts as :

*" 2. Thus, the exercise of identification of permanent vacant posts as well as convening of meetings of DPCs to consider the confirmation of employees against them has become a time-consuming and complicated procedure which has to be gone through under the existing rules before permanent status is conferred upon a Government employee. The delays and complexities involved in complying with the procedural requirements of confirmation often result in a situation where an employee continues to officiate in successive higher grades for years together while he is confirmed only in the grade he entered the service."*

*"3. A Task Force(set up in 1976 vide Ministry of Finance Order No. F.1(5)/75-Spl.Cell dated 5.1.1976) went into the entire question of confirmation with a view to bring about some simplifications. Their main recommendations were:-*

*(i) Confirmation of Govt employees should be delinked from the availability of permanent vacant posts...."*

Vide letter No. NIL, dated 01.09.2020 copy at **Annexure VIII of BOG 21.10 at page no. 195-197**, the Institute was in receipt of the representation from the incumbent Deputy Registrar **Mrs. Lalthianghlimi Zote**, citing on her grievances related to her service confirmation at NIT Mizoram and long pending issues regarding the non - availability of a regular sanctioned post of Deputy Registrar in the Institute.



Though the officer's service condition has been deliberated a number of times in the past BoG Meetings, tangible resolution to the officer's grievances had not been arrived till date. Aggrieved with the aforesaid, the officer has indicated her option to seek legal redress, if the long standing issues of 09 years is not resolved.

The matter is placed before the Board for consideration and advice.

### **PART C**

Vide letter No. NIL dated 17.09.2020 copy placed at **Annexure IX of BOG 21.10 at page no. 198-206** the Institute is in receipt of a representation from the Superintendent, Mr. Benjamin Lalbiakmuana, citing certain relevant issues:

The 02<sup>nd</sup> BoG vide BOG 2.15(1) had decided to adjust the post of Deputy Registrar (PB-3 GP Rs. 7600) to the sanctioned vacant post of Assistant Registrar (PB-3 GP Rs. 5400) (copy placed at **Annexure X of BOG 21.10 at page no. 207-211**).

However, vide letter No. NITMZ/C-75/2012/1194 dated 10<sup>th</sup> January, 2019 (Copy placed at **Annexure XI of BOG 21.10 at page no. 212-215**) the Institute had proposed for surrender of the post of SAS Officer (PB-3, GP- Rs. 5400) to accommodate the incumbent Deputy Registrar. It is standing contention of the Institute that the incumbent Deputy Registrar, Mrs. Lalthianghlimi Zote be accommodated into the post of SAS Officer, for which re-appropriation of the said posts may be approved for.

The essential requirement of having an incumbent regular Assistant Registrar in the Institute cannot be over emphasised, as the Establishment of NIT Mizoram is functioning with bare minimum strength as under:

At the same time, with the anticipated re-appropriation of SAS Officer into the post of Deputy Registrar would help reinforce the establishment of NIT Mizoram and simultaneously, enable the long delayed service confirmation of the incumbent Deputy Registrar, Mrs. Lalthianghlimi Zote.

Copy of the Notification issued is placed at <b>Annexure I of BOG 21.13 at page no. 235-236.</b> The meeting further decided to refer the matter to the BoG on whether the remaining components of the Academic Fees and the Hostel Fees may be deferred or waiver of the said fees till normalcy or students are back on campus. Estate Section submitted observations on the bills. The same was sent to M/s IRCON Intl. Ltd vide Letter dated 26.02.2019 for necessary compliance. The reply to the observation was sent by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide Letter dated 15.04.2019.

The details/ reply submitted by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd were found to be inadequate by Estate Section which submitted remarks against the reply. The same was sent to M/s IRCON for compliance vide Letter dated 01.06.2019.

The matter was brought up in the 12<sup>th</sup> BWC held on the 19<sup>th</sup> of June, 2019 vide **BWC 12.4** "Observation of various final bills submitted by M/s IRCON Intl. Ltd"; where the 12<sup>th</sup> BWC decided-

*"The BWC observed the comments (sent to M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide letter dated 26.02.2019) made on the 13th Expenditure Bill submitted by M/s IRCON vide letter dated 01.10.2018. The BWC also observed the reply given by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide letter dated 15.04.2019.*

*Further, the BWC also observed the observation on the reply made by Estate Section sent to M/s IRCON vide letter dated 01.06.2019.*

*In addition, the BWC was informed by the Executive Engineer (Civil) that M/s IRCON has responded to the points raised in the letter dated 01.06.2019 received on 15.06.2019 which are yet to be examined.*

*The BWC decided that the Dean (P&D) and the Estate Section should examine the reply given in discussion with M/s IRCON Intl. Ltd and place the findings in the next BWC as a fresh Agenda for settlement of the works."*

As per the direction of the 12<sup>th</sup> BWC, the matter was discussed by Dean (P&D) & Estate Section with M/s IRCON Intl Ltd and M/s IRCON Intl Ltd submitted compliance to the issues raised vide letter dated 01.08.2019, placed at **Annexure I of BOG 21.14 at page no 260-262 .**

‡ It has come to the notice that the approved Minutes of 7<sup>th</sup> BWC were not placed to the 7<sup>th</sup> FC & 8<sup>th</sup> BOG due to oversight although the Approved Cost of ₹ 164.49 Cr has been brought in the description of Agenda in the subsequent meetings of the FC/BoG; in the 10<sup>th</sup> FC held on 17.12.2018 against the agenda description of FC 10.9 it was inadvertently cited that the Approved Cost of Project was approved in the 7<sup>th</sup> FC & 8<sup>th</sup> BOG. While submitting the Revised Cost Proposal the Approved Cost was shown as ₹ 164.49 Cr which was subsequently placed to the EFC. The Approved Cost of the Project as per Approved RCE is ₹ 474.23 Cr. which includes ₹ 164.49 Cr. for the work carried out by IRCON Intl. Ltd.

M/s IRCON Intl Ltd have accepted deduction of ₹ 3,64,958.41 for the following against points raised by the Estate Engineering-  
₹ 1,15,000/- against brought forward errors.

₹ 2,34,025/- against repair charge of damaged PCC breast wall citing that the sub-contractor has demobilised.

₹ 15,348.41/- against placing of sand in place of aggregates in weep holes.

M/s IRCON Intl Ltd did not accept deduction for the following cases-

Excess supply of lights, wire & fixtures which have been shown by them in "**Material Reconciliation Statement**", amounting to ₹ 1,69,54,861.30; citing that-

*"Electrical items for Illumination works had been procured for Peripheral Road, Internal Road as per initial planning in 2015, but works could not be completed due to shortage of fund. Accordingly, balance materials shall be consumed during execution of External Development works"*

M/s IRCON has submitted a drawing showing utilisation of the excess materials in illumination works for internal roads (which is to be undertaken during External Development Works) and stating that it is "*General Arrangement drawing as per initial planning in 2015*".

Also, in a separate letter dated 05.07.2019 M/s IRCON Intl Ltd (included in **Annexure I of BOG 21.14**) has stated-

*"Materials such as Electrical poles and other ancillary materials*



were planned and procured for Illuminations of Peripheral Road and Internal Road, so that uniformity of campus can be assured. During construction, priority was given to Peripheral road and its illuminations. At the time when review of works and financial status of Project was made, it was observed that estimated cost of works has been exhausted while completing the peripheral road, Cable Trench, Site drains and other related ancillary works, accordingly works of internal road and its illumination works were stopped till the external development works of the project starts, for which estimate is pending with appropriate authority."

It is necessary to mention that in the eventuality of accepting the expenditure the Institute will be required to take hand over of the excess materials lying at site and put security in place for watch and ward. Also, given the curtailment in the RCE proposal it is to be noted that use of such light & fixtures would also necessitate further expenditure for installation.

Expenditure against External Development Consultancy works amounting to ₹ 54,87,090.00; citing that-

*"Consultancy Services was awarded for Providing Engineering and Architectural consultancy for external Development works & External Services for National Institute of Technology, Mizoram by IRCON as per requirement and approval from NIT Mizoram. The agency has already submitted the detailed Engineering (Concept, Design & Drawing) along with estimated cost for the proposed External Development Works & External Services for the new campus of NIT Mizoram. IRCON, in turn, has also submitted the same to NIT Mizoram for their approval. The bills raised by the agency in terms of the contract has been paid to the agency and simultaneously billed to NIT. Any withholding or non-payment of the bill will not be justified. Since IRCON has released the payment to the agency against work done, the same should be paid to IRCON (As direct cost) along with IRCON's Fees, any such withholding on this account is not justified and not acceptable. Copy of LOA has also been given to NIT Mizoram."*

#### **Additional Pertinent issues-**

A query was posed after the Exit Conference of Special Audit by the Office of The Principal Accountant General, Mizoram seeking the copies of "Original Detailed Estimate of ₹ 86.23 Cr" & "Revised Detailed Estimate of ₹ 138.82 Cr (including Service & Approach Road)". The Institute had asked vide letter No. NITMZ/Works/IRCON/4/2019/388 dated 17.03.2020.

Copy of Query & the Institute's



M/s IRCON is placed as **Annexure-V of BOG 21.14 at page no 333**

The Institute received response from M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide letter No. IRCON/2058/NIT-Mizo/Corres.N.I.T./02/588 dated 20.03.2020. On checking the response, it was observed that M/s IRCON Intl Ltd has only submitted **Summary of Estimate** and failed to submit the copies of "Original Detailed Estimate of ₹86.23 Cr" & " Revised Detailed Estimate of ₹ 138.82 Cr (including Service & Approach Road)". The same was intimated to M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide Letter No. NITMZ/Works/IRCON/4/2019/464 dated 21.05.2020, for which no response has been received from M/s IRCON.

Later vide letter No. IRCON/2058/NIT-Mizo/Corres.NIT/02/986 dt. 28-08-2020, M/s IRCON Intl Ltd submitted the **Original Detailed Estimate**. And further vide letter No. IRCON/2058/NIT-Mizo/Corres.NIT/02/994 dated 09.09.2020 M/s IRCON Intl Ltd submitted the Summary of Estimate for Revised Estimate of ₹ 139.82 Cr stating that -

*"..... the Department has demarcated more land which was surveyed and the area finally handed over to IRCON for construction was 190.35 Acre (7,70,156.10 sqm). The quantum increase was 38.83%. It was quite normal and obvious that Cost Estimate would definitely vary proportionate to the increase in land area and the exact cost of works could be firmed up and ascertained only after completion of entire works as assigned. Accordingly, interim Revised Estimate was prepared based upon the average rates available for various packages and in a broader way head-wise in the sequence as given in the original estimate. Detailing as it was done in Original Estimate was not exercised for Revised Estimate. The approximation mainly carried out to present broader probable significant changes as per local site conditions to apprise NIT, Mizoram and to give interim approval for Revised Estimate so that work could be proceeded without any financial obstructions. It was known fact that final cost of works would only be finalized when entire works are completed physically and final bills are prepared....."*

Copy of Letter is placed at **Annexure VI of BOG 21.14 at page no 334**

**(B)** The issue of approval of Estimate for Consultancy Works for Statutory Clearance & External Development Engineering was taken up in the **11<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 17.12.2018 vide BWC 11.6-**  
**"Approval of Cost Estimate as per IRCON's Letter of Acceptance to M/s Adharshila Designs Pvt. Ltd for the work of Consultancy for External Development & Statutory Clearances and including the same in the approved estimate"**; where the 11<sup>th</sup> BWC decided-



*"The committee (constituted as per direction of EFC) which visited the permanent site of NIT Mizoram has recommended that only part of land maybe taken into account for construction works and accordingly estimated the cost of construction which is far less than the earlier estimation. The amount projected by the Committee for the construction works was further recommended by the EFC in their meeting held on 11.10.2018 and subsequently taken before Cabinet.*

*Therefore, it is recommended to wait for final approval of Cabinet before finalizing any tender process related to construction work so that the admissible charges on cost of construction."*

The issue of **"Forest Clearance"** which was also brought in the 12<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 09.06.2019 vide **BWC 12.5**. The most pertinent point being that NIT Mizoram was issued **"Stay Order Notice"** by DFO, Mamit dated **31.08.2017** stating that any work at the permanent campus was an encroachment of forest land and should be stopped. The "Stay Order Notice" was sent to M/s IRCON Intl Ltd vide letter No. **NITMZ/Works/ENV.CLR/2015/597 Dated 04<sup>th</sup> Sept, 2017** for necessary action and compliance.

The Institute has taken up the matter with the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Mizoram and a number of meetings with the Secretary & Commissioner, Deptt. of Higher & Technical Education, Govt. of Mizoram. **In a meeting held in the office of Minister of Law & Justice (also Minister of State for Environment, Forest & Climate Change), Govt. of Mizoram on the 17.01.2020 it was agreed that all the liabilities should be borne by the State Government through Higher & Technical Department** and NIT Mizoram authorities were to re-submit forest clearance petition. Also, on **27.01.2020** meeting was held by a Joint re-survey team consisting of members from Deptt. of Higher & Technical, Deptt. of Land, Revenue & Settlement, Deptt. of Environment Forest & Climate Change & NIT Mizoram. It was decided that surface survey requires to be done to the identified Riverine Reserve Forest (RRF). The details of the Institute's action will form part of separate agenda **BOG 21.18**.

Therefore for settlement of the expenditure bills, submitted by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd against expenditure incurred in the final bills of sub-contracts, decisions on the following items were placed to the 13<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 31.08.2020-

Acceptance or Rejection of Excess material worth ₹ **1,69,54,861.30/-** for lighting of internal roads in next phase of work at site.

Acceptance or Rejection of Expenditure claimed against External Development Consultancy works worth ₹ **54,87,090/-**.

The 13<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 31.08.2020 decided as below-

*"Since there is a Special Audit pending query, the BWC asked the Institute to pursue submission of required Revised Detailed Cost Estimate from M/s IRCON Intl Ltd. Further, the decisions as per the agenda are as follows-*

*The BWC recommends approval for settlement of expenditure against Compliances & Variation Statement.*

*Agency fees to be paid will be applicable as per Clause 2.0 of the MoU, "PAYABLE COST FOR WORK AND CENTAGE".*

*BWC has decided to 'PUT ON HOLD' the decision regarding 'Acceptance or Rejection of excess material worth ₹1,69,54,861.30/- for Illumination of Internal Roads'. However, the BWC decided to look into the possibility of onward utilization of the excess materials, these may be verified from the site by the Institute. The Institute shall seek the help of BWC Member Mr. CH Lalnunchama, SE(Electrical), PWD, Govt. of Mizoram for verifying if the materials are in working condition and in light of the observations of the Special Audit. The report shall be brought to the notice of the next BWC, to take decision in light of the approved RCE.*

*BWC has decided to 'PUT ON HOLD' the decision regarding 'Acceptance or Rejection of expenditure claimed against External development Consultancy works worth ₹54,87,090.00/- .The Institute shall come up with breakup of approved RCE, place it to the next BWC for approval and based on this shall calculate admissible amount for part work carried out by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd against Consultancy on External Development.*

Thus, decision regarding finalisation/ payment of outstanding dues is required, in light of the decisions in the previous agenda item **BOG 21.14** regarding settlement of the expenditure bills submitted by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd, against expenditure incurred in the final bills of sub-contracts. 'It is seen from the footnote at page 28 of the Agenda that the Institute will be able to finalize the tax amount and direct cost amount after seeking final bills of M/s IRCON Intl. Ltd.(the PMC) and verifying them. As the taxes claimed are Rs.5.74 crore against approved cost of Rs.77.24 lakh, how the Institute is proposing settlement of expenditure submitted by the PMC without getting final bills from them. **Detailed Estimate for ₹ 139.82 Cr"** as asked by The Office of Principal Accountant General, Mizoram and that the closure of Special Audit is pending.

The Letter is placed at **Annexure II of BOG 21.16 at page no 376-377.**

Moreover, the Institute has informed vide letter dated 02.12.2019 that-

*"there are issues in the bill which requires decision for settlement and the Institute will place the same in the upcoming meetings of the Institute Statutory bodies BWC/FC/BOG for specific directions/decisions so that the issues are resolved, settlement of bills done and status of dues finalised."*

The Letter is placed at **Annexure III of BOG 21.16 at page no. 378.**

In the said letter, M/s IRCON Intl Ltd has tried to invoke Clause 8.1 of the MoU, and citing a Supreme Court of India decision stated that **"the Director, NIT Mizoram has become incapacitate to appoint a Sole Arbitrator for resolution of disputes between the parties."**

Also, M/s IRCON Intl Ltd proposed that  
Either

(a) NIT Mizoram/Owner to give consent to anyone out of the 5 proposed individual to function as a Sole Arbitrator within 30 days.

(b) NIT Mizoram/Owner to give consent for a 03 members Arbitral Tribunal within 30days.

The Institute has studied the claim and found out that-

1) As per the MoU/MoA the work is to be carried out from work advance.

2) Special Audit on infrastructure development of NIT Mizoram underway has sought "detailed estimate" which was not provided by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd.

3) The Institute has not pointed out 'disputes'/ 'agreement'/ 'disagreement' to the final bills submitted.

In light of the letter received from M/s IRCON Intl Ltd, the Institute has sought Legal Advisory from Mr. Lalchanhima Sailo, Advocate, Aizawl as to the viability of the demand of dispute/arbitration claimed. Following



is the gist of the advice received-

1) In relation to the ruling of the Supreme Court relied upon by M/s IRCON Intl Ltd i.e. TRF Ltd. Vs Energo Engineering Projects Ltd., 2015, it may be indicated that the facts of the case as well as the Order passed by the Hon'ble Apex Court are poles apart and hold no relevance to the alleged dispute so claimed to have arisen between NIT Mizoram and M/s IRCON Intl Ltd.

2) NIT Mizoram should convey to M/s IRCON that the alleged inability of the Director to appoint Sole Arbitrator does not hold.

3) It would be advisable for the Director to nominate and appoint a sole arbitrator at the earliest possible so as not to break the 30 day limitation period for appointment counted from the date of receiving the letter from M/s IRCON Intl Ltd.

Copy of the Legal Advice is placed as ***Annexure IV of BOG 21.16 at page no 379-382***

Acting on the legal advisory, the Institute has also conveyed its stand to M/s IRCON Intl Ltd .

Copy of the Letter to IRCON is enclosed at ***Annexure V of BOG 21.16 at page no 383-386.***

The matter was placed before 13<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 31.08.2020 for information and advice.

The 13<sup>th</sup> BWC held on 31.08.2020 decided-

"M/s IRCON Intl Ltd be intimated regarding BWC stand for retraction of the Arbitration Claim as decided in the BWC. M/s IRCON Intl Ltd shall further be informed to respond to the official Corresp. issued by the Institute vide letter No. IRCON/WORKS/IRCON/4/2019/692 Dated 19.08.2020 on or before 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2020."

On 10<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2019 the Director, NIT Mizoram & the Principal Secretary, EF&CC Mizoram visited NIT Mizoram permanent campus alongwith the EE (Civil) where they were alighted that for getting Forest Conservation Act Clearance it would be required on the part of the Institute to **demarcate no-construction/ afforestation zones** in the Master Plan copy.

On 11<sup>th</sup> of Dec, 2019 EE(Civil) & Dean P&D met the PCCF, Deptt. of EF&CC, Govt. of Mizoram, at his office and were apprised with a printed copy of the filled up Application Form (Form A Part1), that the application was complete but could not get through for **In Principle Approval** due to the query raised by DFO Mamit and that the reply to the query is essential for further processing of the application. The same was verified online by EE(Civil) & Dean, P&D with the ID/password provided by officials of M/s IRCON Intl Ltd on the same date.

Accordingly, a letter was sent by the Institute to the PCCF, vide No. NITMZ/Works/ENV.CLR/2015/1200 Dtd. 12<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2109, copy at **Annexure I of BOG 21.18 at page no 402**, stating that the stand of the Institute on claim of compensatory afforestation against submission of documents for Forest Clearance is that the - **"Land has been allotted to the Deptt. of Higher & Technical by Govt. of Mizoram for NIT Mizoram. Work has only started after getting the Land Lease Certificate. If there is any dispute between Forest Department and Dept. of Higher & Technical Deptt., this must be resolved between the parties"**.

This letter was uploaded in the Forest Clearance portal Environment, Forest, Wildlife against query raised by DFO Mamit, Deptt. of EF&CC, Govt. of Mizoram.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of January, 2020 a meeting was convened by the Govt. of Mizoram in the office of Minister, Law & Judicial (who is also the Minister of State for Environment, Forest & Climate Change), Government of Mizoram. Representatives from Deptt. of Higher & Technical, Deptt. of Land, Revenue & Settlement, Deptt. of Environment Forest & Climate Change were present alongwith the Director, NIT Mizoram and team. The minutes of meeting deliberated that spot verification for re-survey of the site should



be conducted and subject to the outcome of re-survey of the site, re-calculation of compensatory afforestation and Net Present Value (NPV) should be worked out. Also, that **all the liabilities should be borne by the State Government through Higher & Technical Department** and NIT Mizoram authorities were advised to re-submit clearance petition.

Subsequent to the above meeting a spot verification survey was conducted on the 27<sup>th</sup> of January, 2020 by Joint re-survey team consisting of members from Deptt. of Higher & Technical, Deptt. of Land, Revenue & Settlement, Deptt. of Environment Forest & Climate Change & NIT Mizoram. It was decided that surface survey requires to be done to the identified Riverine Reserve Forest (RRF) i.e the distance between the boundary of NIT Mizoram site and Tlawng River. Also, that NIT Mizoram will clear the jungle for surface survey.

A letter was sent by the Institute to the Director, Higher & Technical Education (Technical Wing), Government of Mizoram, regarding confirmation for provision and manpower for jungle clearance for surface survey to work alongwith the Surveyors.

The Director, Land Revenue & Settlement has finalised the forest area within the campus as 158.784 acres and further action is under process.
